



University of Florida College of Pharmacy Academic Teaching Certificate Course

Audience

This course is designed for pharmacy residents, fellows, and graduate students who are interested in learning more about teaching.

Goal

To prepare participants for teaching future pharmacists and for engaging with lifelong learning. In addition to a discussion of academic topics and active mentoring, participants will receive formal training in delivering pharmacy education in the classroom and in the clinical practice environment. This will occur through course facilitation in the classroom, precepting pharmacy students in their advanced pharmacy practice experiences, and providing a formal lecture.

Requirements (Residents/fellows/graduate students)

1. Complete FERPA and HIPAA trainings, assigned by College of Pharmacy Human Resources.
2. View lectures, engage in readings, and complete assignments as posted on the course website.
3. Facilitate approximately 20 hours total in the fall and/or spring semester(s). This may include skills lab or other courses. Assignments will be coordinated by each campus liaison.
4. Assist with precepting clerkship (APPE) students at your residency site (minimum 8 weeks).
5. Prepare and provide a one hour pharmacy lecture. An assigned College of Pharmacy faculty member or other designee will serve as the mentor and will approve content and presentation delivery.
6. Prepare a teaching philosophy.
7. Participate in quarterly, synchronous sessions with the teaching certificate course leader (Katie Vogel Anderson).

Those who successfully complete the program by meeting all of the above requirements will receive a certificate from The University of Florida College of Pharmacy.

Enrollment Information

Those interested in participating will submit an electronic application in July. The link to the application will be sent to residency program directors and faculty mentors, who will then share with incoming residents, fellows, and graduate students. The certificate program starts in August and concludes in June, to mirror the schedule of the postgraduate residency year.
